It was a busy and productive year at Central Vermont Habitat for Humanity.



- We are putting the finishing touches on a duplex in Randolph
- We broke ground on three new homes, one in Barre and a duplex in Greensboro
- We completed 12 home repair and disaster relief projects
- Volunteers provided 5,698 hours to CVHFH
- Our Dome to Home Project included 271 volunteer hours to produce wall panels for the Barre build
- We worked with students from Central VT and Randolph Technical Centers thanks to 0% interest loans through the Vermont Community Loan Funds CTE Revolving Forgivable Loan Fund
